

Our job at the library is to help grow and build a strong community. We do this by allowing free access to technology, offering free information and education, and lending free entertainment in various formats.



Souris Library Welcomes Province-Wide Review of Services

The head librarian at the Glenwood and Souris Regional Library is optimistic that a review of the province's library services announced this week by the Manitoba government will mean positive growth, including greater access to digital media.

"Libraries have changed," says Connie Bradshaw. "Fewer people are reading hard copy books. More and more get their media from other sources so we can't remain the same."

In announcing the review, Sport, Culture and Heritage Minister Rochelle Squires noted that provincial policies regarding libraries have changed little over the past 30 years. The government plans to gather information from stakeholders to develop "high-quality service at a reasonable cost".

Glenwood and Souris Regional Library is primarily funded by taxpayers: the province and the Municipality of Souris-Glenwood each contribute about \$30,000 per year to an \$80,000 operating budget for core staff and volunteers.

Bradshaw is hoping the review leads to better technological resources. "We need more computer literacy for seniors," she says. "We also need more access to materials in digital format."

Souris Library Welcomes Province-Wide Review of Services - SOUTHWEST POST

A Souris library card gives the user access to online books through eLibraries Manitoba and magazines via Zinio, a program billed as the "world's largest newsstand" with digital versions of dozens of best-selling periodicals.



"I use the e-library," says Heather Hiebert, a voracious reader who can finish a novel in a day. "It's very convenient." Juggling an armful of books, the Carroll-area resident says she still visits the library weekly, selecting material for herself and the five of her seven children still living at home.

Despite a growing appetite for online materials, attendance at the Souris library has remained relatively steady. In 2015, the library recorded over 6,800 visits by patrons, up slightly from both 2013 and 2014.

"I'm here three or four times a week," says Andrew Forsythe, sitting at one of the library's five computers. "This is a sanctuary, a cultural hub," he says.

"I'd be upset if it wasn't here," says former library board member Betty Somersall, sounding a cautionary note regarding the government review. "I don't know what I would

do if I couldn't go to the library for a book. Everybody can't be online."

Bradshaw believes a better sharing of resources among libraries could add to the user's experience. For instance, she would like to see a standardized library card allowing patrons to check out and return materials at any location in the province. She says the Souris library could also benefit from more physical space; a room for meetings, programming or classes.

"We also need more awareness about how important libraries are to communities," she says. "A library does so much."

The province has promised more information in the coming weeks on how library service providers can contribute to the review.

"We want to ensure the support we provide and the services that are offered are delivered as efficiently and effectively as possible," Squires stated in Tuesday's press release.


