

The Glenwood and Souris Regional Library experienced a busy year in 2019. Over the past twelve months, our staff and volunteers made every effort to provide patrons with high quality community service.

Thank you to our valuable volunteers: Rae Laval, Terrie Stelmack, and Joseph Logeot. Board members are also an important element of insuring strong delivery of library services to our community. Our board members for 2019 are Gayle O'Greysik, Mae Hart, Florence Phillips, Todd Walker and Robin Enns.

I thank our staff, volunteers and board members for the work they do to provide a positive library experience within our community.

Twenty nineteen brought a challenge for the Library and its patrons. The town of Souris redesigned, rebuilt and repaved its main east-west 'downtown', the Crescent Avenue West. Throughout the summer and into the fall, this involved blocking access to many of the Crescent Avenue West businesses including the Library. Fortunately, the Library had an alternative access point via Second Street South, through the Manor entrance and down the interior stairs. Furthermore, to begin with, even with good signage, locating the Library was a bit of a mystery.

The Western Manitoba Juried Arts Council winners' work was on display again this year and was appreciated by Library patrons. A popular service at the library is the Drop-In Computer Access and Help. This program is designed to provide community members with technology access and education.

As is the case every year, the Library could not exist without the following major funding partners — the Province of Manitoba and the Municipality of Souris-Glenwood, as well as several smaller organizations, foundations and private donors, all of which make our library possible.

Twenty-twenty has arrived and I am sure we will have another successful year. We look forward to the opportunities to come.

As our costs continue to increase and our operating grants remain constant, I am so grateful that we have a wonderful community who appreciates a public library. Whether by generously volunteering time to help with our daily operations or by donating funds to help keep us current, I am indebted and thankful to so many in 2019.

- We were able to affordably replace our staff and public computers through the program Computers for Schools.
- Grants from Souris Glenwood Foundation and Souris Legion Ladies Auxiliary allowed us
 to greatly increase our collection of audio books on compact disc for those patrons who
 have not embraced the digital format.
- Monetary support from our community through the Souris District Donor's Choice was essential to keeping our operating budget balanced.
- Our reciprocal borrowing agreement with Western Manitoba Regional Library allows residents of the Municipality of Grasslands to choose to be members at our library, giving us some extra income through membership fees.
- Being part of three times a year rotation of large print books supplied by the Public Library Services Branch of Manitoba is important to our library. Large print books are usually sold at a higher cost than standard print; thus, this service is a real benefit for us and our large print readers.

And lastly, I am very grateful to our supportive Library Board, dedicated staff, and hardworking volunteers who all make Glenwood & Souris Regional Library a continuing part of our community.


Arts West Council 40th Travelling Gallery was at the library for two weeks in June.






Audio Books





