

When the library was open, the Computer Drop-In access and help continued to be available. The copying service was much appreciated. Major funding continued from the Province of Manitoba, the Municipality of Souris-Glenwood, and Donor's Choice.

Preparations are being planned toward a major overhaul, fresh paint, flooring, etc. This is possible through the rental agreement with Manitoba Housing, our own saved funds, and some generous donations.

#### Librarian's Report

It was business as usual when the year began with great plans for our future. Then in March our library, along with most of the country, was ordered to close due to the COVID-19 pandemic. We used our mission statement as a guide to work through the challenges of these unprecedented times. We continued to provide materials and services to help community residents of all ages meet their educational, cultural, and recreational needs.

We quickly altered our services to comply with health restrictions and still be able to serve our community. We invited patrons to check-out an unlimited number of books just before the doors had to close in March, and we immediately began to offer home deliveries in a safe manner. It was not until the middle of June that we were finally able to invite patrons back inside the library; although, with reduced hours, limited occupancy with social distancing, and rigid

cleaning protocols. To have in-person library visits again was truly a day to celebrate! As cases of COVID-19 began to rise in November, the Province of Manitoba moved to the Critical level, and we were once again forced to close our doors. We immediately launched our curbside pick-up and resumed our delivery services.

This pandemic has been a great opportunity to reflect on our present role and consider new ways to continue being a vital hub of our community. During this pandemic, we did not have the resources to offer or promote virtual programming and connections; thus, we need to focus on this valuable means of service as we move forward.

Although 2020 is gone, the pandemic remains, and our doors are still closed in January. For now, we will continue to adapt and shift our services in response to present needs. As we move through 2021, we will use our new insights and experiences to initiate valuable new ways to better serve our patrons in the years to come.

The library joined with Fun Time Pottery to offer a Valentine's Day story and paint program for preschool and school age children.








## February - I Love to Read Month

The library participated in the teddy bear hunt aimed at spreading cheer during the pandemic




Library board meetings looked a little different during the pandemic.



We were finally allowed in-person visits to the library in June. We adapted ourselves to the new health protocols.







When we were forced to close again in November, we immediately set up an indoor pickup area.

#### No organization stands alone when serving the community.


